How to Apply: Applicants to ASU must submit the following:

1. Submit properly completed and signed application for admission.
2. Enclose a \$30.00 non-refundable application fee.
3. Complete immunization form. ALL new students enrolling at ASU must submit an immunization form, which is available in the Office of Admissions and on our web site at www.aug.edu/admissions/documents.htm.
4. Submit documents required for your enrollment status. See classifications below.

DEGREE SEEKING APPLICANTS

BEGINNING FRESHMAN: (students who have graduated from a regionally accredited high school or the equivalent)

1. Students should request an official high school transcript and schedule of senior courses if applicable be sent by the appropriate high school official to the ASU Admissions Office.
2. Students should request SAT or ACT scores be sent to ASU by the high school counselor or from the educational testing service.
3. Students who have earned the GED should have the official score report sent to the ASU Admissions Office, along with a partial high school transcript showing what high school curriculum was completed.
4. Home schooled students should contact Admissions for more information.

LIFE ENRICHMENT: (students who have been out of high school for five years or more and have fewer than 30 transferable semester credit hours) Students should have their high school transcript (or equivalent) sent to the ASU Admissions Office. The SAT (or ACT) is not required, however, the student is required to take the Compass Examination and complete Learning Support requirements, if necessary. To exempt COMPASS English and Reading students may present SAT scores of 500 or more (or the ACT equivalent). All students will take the COMPASS Math for placement. Test dates must be within 7 years.

TRANSFER: (students who have attended a regionally accredited college)

1. Students should request official transcripts be sent directly to the ASU Admissions Office from ALL regionally accredited colleges attended.
2. Students who have less than 30 semester hours (45 quarter hours) of transferable credit should request an official high school transcript and SAT (or ACT) scores be sent to the ASU Admissions Office. These students are subject to the College Preparatory Curriculum requirements as well as Learning Support policies.

ADDITIONAL UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE: (students who have earned a bachelor’s degree and want to earn a second undergraduate degree)

1. Students should request official transcripts from ALL regionally accredited colleges attended be sent to the Office of Admissions.
2. Once all transcripts are received, students should schedule an interview with an admissions officer.

FORMER STUDENT: (a student who has previously attended ASU) Students who have attended ASU and have not enrolled in any other institution since their last enrollment at ASU must complete a FORMER STUDENT APPLICATION available in the Registrar’s Office. If the last enrollment was completed with the student graduating, the student needs to re-apply as an additional degree, post bacc or post-graduate student, depending on what degree was earned.

NON-DEGREE SEEKING APPLICANTS

POST BACCALAUREATE/POST GRADUATE: (students who have completed a bachelor’s degree or higher from a regionally accredited college) Students should request an official transcript be sent from the institution where the highest degree was earned. If the highest degree is a bachelor’s degree, the student will be a post-baccalaureate student; if the highest degree is a master’s degree or higher, the student will be a post-graduate student.

JOINT ENROLLMENT: (students concurrently enrolled in high school and college courses) Students must submit their high school transcript, SAT (or ACT) scores, and a Joint Enrollment Clearance Form. Students must also complete an Accel Program Application and schedule an admissions interview after all the above paperwork has been received by Admissions.

TRANSIENT: (undergraduate or graduate students seeking temporary admission to ASU while completing their degree at another institution)

1. Students should request an official letter be sent directly to the ASU Admissions Office from the registrar of the home institution, indicating good academic standing and recommending admission to ASU as a transient student.
2. Students should request an official transcript be sent from the institution granting the permission. This document is needed to prove prerequisites have been satisfied.

AUDIT: (students who wish to attend ASU classes, but earn no credit) Students should submit an official transcript with the highest degree earned. Students who enroll on an audit basis are required to pay tuition and attend class, however, no credit is awarded for the class.

RESIDENCY DISCLAIMER

To qualify for Georgia’s in-state tuition, the applicant must have resided in the state of Georgia or the bordering counties of Aiken or Edgefield, S.C. for 12 consecutive months prior to the beginning of the semester. If not, in-state classification will not be granted, unless it can be shown that the applicant’s parent, spouse, or court-appointed guardian resided in Georgia (or Edgefield/Aiken) continuously for the 12-month period. Normally, classification as a non-resident will apply throughout the entire time that the applicant is enrolled at the university. Attendance at another institution in Georgia or the identified counties in South Carolina does not constitute “residency” and is not considered when determining whether an applicant is eligible for in-state tuition. Dependent students of families moving to Georgia for employment or military purposes may be eligible for an out-of state tuition waiver. Please contact ASU’s Office of Admissions for documentation requirements and other information.

English Requirements for Non-native speakers of English

(Native or primary speakers of English have been raised in an English speaking environment for no less than the past six years. They may speak a language other than English in the home, but speak English exclusively outside the home in social and educational contexts.)

If you are not a native or primary speaker of English, please take the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) and have an official

score report sent directly from the test center to the Office of Admissions at Augusta State University. Our institution code for score reports is 5336.

*TOEFL requirements can be waived for students who have attended high school in the United States and have a verbal SAT score of 510 or more. The requirement can also be waived for students who have attended a regionally accredited college or university in the United States and completed the equivalent of English 1101 (College Composition) with a grade of C or better.
