



Faculty Meeting Minutes

March 16, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m.

The minutes from the January 4, 2010, faculty meeting were approved unanimously.

Dr. Geren gave an update on the Faculty Policies meetings and concerns related to communication. The Faculty Policies committee is going to propose some changes at the next ASU faculty meeting. Faculty can attend the Faculty Policies meetings which take place every Monday from 2:30 to 4:00 p.m.

Dr. Hardy announced that the PSC is changing certification again for Educational Leadership. The program will have to include new residency courses, because the PSC wants individuals with the L6 to convert to the new PL6 in order to be promoted. Currently those who have completed the program received a L6, but if a person is promoted he or she is required to get the new PL within three years. The proposed courses will be 8351, 8352, and 8353.

Dr. Lord asked the faculty to identify needs in case there are some College of Education "end of year" funds.

Dr. Lord informed the faculty that the decision has not been finalized on which colleges will be moving to the new location on Wrightsboro Road. He asked the faculty to let him know what needs they may have in the new building in case we have to move, and what needs they may have in this building in case we remain.

Dr. Geren informed the faculty that Carol Hoyle, the candidate for the Special Education position, will be on campus all day tomorrow, March 17.
