Financial Aid Opportunities

A quality education is priceless, but it's also affordable. As a state-supported public institution, the tuition at Augusta State University is surprisingly low—typically less than half of that of private institutions. And, there is a generous amount of financial aid to help qualified students.

The process of applying for financial aid may seem complicated, but it really is not. The Financial Aid staff will work with you to help you complete the process. Basically, all financial aid programs fall into one of four categories: grants, loans, scholarships, and employment opportunities.

Financial Aid Mission

The mission of the Financial Aid Office is to provide financial resources to all qualified applicants who would like to obtain a postsecondary education. In doing so, the Financial Aid Office supports the mission of the University in its commitment to excellence in teaching, advancement of knowledge, and enrichment of the community, in that many students would not have access to higher education without adequate financial support. We also support the mission of the Student Affairs Division by providing students with the wherewithal to achieve academic and professional growth by providing the financial resources that contribute to retention and student success.

Apply for Admission to Augusta State University

A financial aid award cannot be made until you are admitted to the university as a degree seeking student for the term(s) covered by your financial aid application. Applications are available from the Admissions Office, 737-1632 or 1-800-341-4373, or visit their website at www.aug.edu/admissions. The office is located in the Benet House on the Walton Way campus.

Important note: Joint-enrolled students are considered non-degree seeking students; and, as such, do not qualify for federal, state, or institutional aid (including institutional scholarships). Joint-enrolled students may qualify for financial assistance from the HOPE Accel Program which covers approved courses only.

Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

The FAFSA must be completed before any type of federal grant or loan is awarded. You may now apply for federal student aid by using the Internet. The Department of Education strongly encourages students and parents to apply for federal student aid by using the Internet. In an effort to support the online process, the ASU Financial Aid Office recommends that students and parents file their FAFSAs electronically (online) before the published application submission deadlines. The FAFSA online website is www.fafsa.ed.gov.

The online process is as easy as 1, 2, and 3. Simply go to the website listed and follow the instructions. All FAFSA questions must be answered; please do not leave any items blank. If the value is zero,

please enter a zero as your response. Incomplete electronic FAFSAs will not be fully processed; therefore, please ensure that all questions contain an answer. Be sure to add ASU's Federal School Code as your choice institution. Our Federal School Code is 001552.

HOPE Scholarship Program

Students who are interested in applying for the HOPE Scholarship only should complete the electronic GSFApps at GCollege411.org. A FAFSA is not required. However, students who are interested in applying for federal and state grants, student loans, and the Federal Work Study Program must fill out a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine their eligibility.

Apply Early

Financial aid deadlines have been established. In an effort to better serve our students, the Financial Aid Office has established application submission deadlines for each term. The deadlines serve one primary function: If the financial aid file is complete by the published deadline, it should be processed prior to the published fee payment deadline.

The annual financial aid application deadlines for each term are as follows: **Fall Semester - April 1; Spring Semester - October 1; and Summer Semester - March 1.** You are expected to submit all required applications and support documents prior to the published financial aid application deadline for the chosen enrollment term. If your file has been chosen for verification, please submit copies of the applicable tax returns and a verification worksheet to complete your financial aid file. If you wish to apply for a Federal Stafford Loan or a Parent PLUS, your loan applications must be submitted by the published deadline. Failure to do so may result in incurring your own educational expenses until your financial aid can be processed.

Explore Other Financial Aid Opportunities

Explore other financial aid opportunities. Your family background, civic affiliations, and activities may provide keys to other sources of assistance. There are several publications in libraries that may assist you in obtaining comprehensive information on scholarship programs.

Familiarize yourself with the eligibility requirements of aid programs. Some programs are awarded for demonstrated financial need, some are based entirely on merit or talent, and others may involve a combination of factors.

GRANTS

Grants are awarded on the basis of financial need and do not require repayment. Frequently called gift aid, grants are available through federal and state governments and private sources. To apply for aid in any of the federal programs, you must be a citizen of the United States or intend to become a permanent resident, or be otherwise classified as an eligible noncitizen.
