The Bachelor of Arts Program is designed for students wishing to study art within the framework of liberal arts. It is recommended for the student whose interest in art is more general. (Students interested in the professional degrees should read the requirements for the Bachelor of Fine Arts degrees.)

Portfolio Review - All art majors are required to submit their work for a review by the studio faculty after the completion of the following courses: Art 1520, 1530, 1211, and 12 additional hours of studio art courses (21 hours total.) Portfolio Reviews are scheduled during the Fall Semester. The Portfolio Review must take place the academic year preceding the year of graduation. Passing the Portfolio Review is a prerequisite for Art 4998 and a graduation requirement. If the Portfolio Review is not passed, it must be repeated and passed during the following fall semester. Portfolio Review occurs on the day after the last day of class of the fall semester.
