Candidates for Homecoming 2006 must meet and follow all of the requirements and regulations as outlined below.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

Candidates must meet all of the following criteria for eligibility:

- must be currently enrolled in Spring Semester 2006 for at least 9 semester credit hours,
- must have an institutional GPA of 2.25 or higher,
- must have at least sophomore status (30 semester credit hours or more of ASU work),
- must be a returning student for the 2006-2007 academic year or graduating no earlier than December 2006,
- must be an active member of their sponsoring organization,
- must not be in violation of the Student Code of Conduct,
- must complete and submit appropriate forms by dates designated,
- must attend mandatory candidate meeting, Block Party, candidate reception and coronation ceremony.

BIOGRAPHIES:

Candidate Biographies and Organization Acknowledgment Statements must be turned in to the Student Activities Office by **1:30 PM on Friday, January 20 in order to be eligible to be a candidate.** These biographies will be forwarded to the Bell Ringer and Web page, and will be recreated for the display case to accompany your photo. The biographies will be printed as submitted and you must limit your response to the question *What uniquely qualifies you to be Mr./Ms.* to 100 words. You may add your escort's name at a later date.

CANDIDATE MEETING:

A **mandatory** candidate meeting will be held on **Friday, January 27 at 1:00 PM** in Christenberry Fieldhouse. *Attendance at this meeting is required for qualification.* This meeting will last for approximately 90 minutes. Rules and regulations concerning campaigning and requirements for the winners will be discussed at this meeting. There will also be a training session with each candidate on using microphones.

CANDIDATE PICTURES:

Pictures will be taken on **Friday, January 27** immediately following the meeting. These pictures will be used in the display case across from the bookstore (along with your biography), submitted to the Bell Ringer and included on the Homecoming Web page.

REQUIREMENTS FOR CANDIDATES:

All candidates must meet the following requirements:

- must turn in biography by Friday, January 20, 2006 by 1:30 pm to the Student Activities Office,
- must attend candidate meeting at 1:00 PM on Friday, January 27,
- must attend Block Party, scheduled from 10 am to 2pm on Monday, February 6,
- their sponsoring student organization **MUST** have a booth at Student Organization Day, Wednesday, February 8 from 10:00 am – 1:00 pm
- must attend the Bonfire & Pep Rally, scheduled for 6:00 – 9:30 pm, Thursday, February 9
- must attend Candidate Reception and Coronation Ceremony at Homecoming (CFH) on Saturday, February 11 - candidates must check in before 7:00 PM

Candidates who are unable to attend any of these mandatory events because of a class conflict, or other emergency must contact Kay Phillips-Crabb, in the Student Activities Office (737-1609), in advance of the event so that other arrangements can be discussed. Failure to contact Ms. Crabb before the event may result in automatic disqualification.

WINNER'S REQUIREMENTS AND AWARDS:

Mr./Ms. ASU 2006 will be required to complete the following:

- Select an approved site to do 5 hours of community service.
- Make 2 recruiting trips.
- Make an appearance at A Day for Augusta State University.
- Be available on a consulting basis to the Homecoming Committee during their term.
- Make other appearances/parades as asked by the Homecoming Committee.
- Promote Homecoming for the next year by being available for TV spots, etc.
- Must be available for Homecoming 2007 coronation ceremony.

Upon completion of the above requirements, Mr. and Ms. ASU will receive one semester of resident tuition. Winners must attend one semester after the semester they are awarded the title of Mr. or Ms. ASU and complete the above requirements in order to receive the tuition.
