

# Becoming a Senator

The Student Government Association is always looking for more students to serve our school by joining the Student Senate. The fuller, more complete a body the Senate is, the better it will be able to represent the student body. Although the size of the Senate is limited, it has not currently reached that size this school year.

There are two methods for joining the Student Senate. The first is to take part in the general elections which take place every year near the end of the spring semester. Students run in this election to become a Senator the following fall semester.

Students who did not apply to take part in the general elections can apply to fill a vacancy within the Senate, as long as it has not reached its full capacity. To do so, students need to fill out an application, part of which includes obtaining the signatures of seventy-five people whom they have informed of their intention to join the Senate.

To become a Senator, students need to have a G.P.A. of 2.25 and be a student enrolled at ASU for at least three hours a semester. Students can obtain applications for the Senate from the SGA office or from the office of Student Activities, both of which are located in the JSAC. After completing an application students should turn it into the Student Activities office. Assuming the application is accepted, the next step is a short interview with the Committee on Committees, whose job it is to recommend new Senators.
