

Temporary/Part-Time Employment Opportunity

Positions: Data Collection Specialists

Background: The Augusta Community Partnership for Children has been awarded a grant by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to implement an abstinence-only curriculum in select middle schools in the Augusta area. As part of the evaluation effort associated with the project, data will be collected from middle school students at seven area middle schools. The Department of Educational Leadership, Counseling and Special Education at Augusta State University has been contracted to provide advice and assistance in the evaluation effort. Graduate students are needed to assist with this data collection effort.

Responsibilities: Individuals selected for this assignment will be required to attend an orientation/training session in September, 2009 (approximately 4 hours). Data collection in the seven schools will occur in the fall (Sept/Oct) of 2009. During the data collection period, three scales will be given to participating students at each school in a group setting: The Adolescent Family Life Scale, the Adult-Youth Engagement Scale, and the Developmental Asset Profile. All three scales can be administered in about two and a half hours which includes time for organization and instructions. It is anticipated that each school will be visited twice during each period. It is expected that each data collector will need to commit up to 40 hours to this effort in both fall. Data collectors will work in pairs. Selected individuals must have transportation and will be reimbursed for mileage.

Qualifications: Some experience/interest in assessment, evaluation and research is desirable. Graduate students are preferred. Positions will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

Compensation: Selected individuals will be paid \$15 per hour which includes driving time and training.
