MACH Academy

The mission of the MACH Academy is to provide life skills development through educational, technology and recreational experiences. The focus demographics are inner city and disadvantaged youth, with emphasis on children 3 – 18 living in public assisted housing developments and low/moderate income neighborhoods throughout the Central Savannah River Area.

MACH Academy's programs and services are designed to serve children and youth who are at-risk for academic failure. Programs and services are provided after school year round and through special spring break and summer camp sessions. Participants are paired with caring adults to work on homework assignments, school projects, basic academic and organizational skills, computer techniques, nutrition, career exploration, college planning and recreation. Parents and guardians are invited to work side by side with their child to help increase their knowledge and to increase and encourage positive adult/child interaction.

Dates/Times: Sessions will be held for students 5 – 18 (grades K-12) after school Monday – Friday 3:30 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. at the Fleming Tennis Center 1850 Chester Avenue. The goal for the project is to improve education and literacy skills while keeping students on an academically stable track towards graduation.

Expectations: Volunteer tutors and mentors are needed to be paired with students to teach reading, comprehension, language arts, computer literacy, math, science, social studies, health, conflict resolution and tennis/fitness.

Volunteers will assist students to use computer technologies to increase participants' academic knowledge by means of tutoring, mentoring, online education tools, software education programs, Microsoft Office, online communication and effective research strategies and use of computers.

Volunteers are also needed to assist with college prep and career exploration activities designed to help equip students with the tools and knowledge to be able to compete in our technical world and to become successful, concerned, productive citizens.

Placements in Local Schools

Procedure for securing a field experience placement in a Partner School Network school:

1. DO NOT CONTACT A SCHOOL ON YOUR OWN. There is a procedure in place for contacting and arranging placements. Building coordinators and administrators will redirect you to the university if you contact them.
2. In order to request a placement, you must commit to complete a minimum of 30 field experience hours at the school per semester. A request will not be made for less than 30 hours in recognition of the effort involved securing the placement by the teacher, school, and university.
3. You must attend the Field Experience placement meeting held the first week of the semester in order to receive a field placement. Field placements will not be made for students who do not attend this meeting. Placement meetings are held on the first Thursday of each semester. Check the Teacher Education website for the location and time. You will complete the Field Experience Request Form at this meeting.
