

Augusta State University Student Technology Fee Annual Report 2000-2001

A Technology Fee proposal and plan was set forth in consultation with a representative student body, the Senate of the Student Government Association, faculty, staff, institution administrators, and other information technology professionals on campus, and was approved by the Board of Regents. Included in this plan is the formation of a Student Technology Fee Committee made up of four faculty/staff and four students. This committee reviews proposals for how to allocate the funds, weighs them on the amount of direct benefit to students, and discusses if the proposal follows the guidelines required in the main process plan.

This year, the Student Technology Fee Committee formed by the plan mentioned above, has made several purchases to enhance the Technology capabilities of Augusta State students. Among those purchases include: new computers for the student Writing Center and library 3rd floor, lab printers for some of the student labs, site license for the Career Center's student web resume/job search program, new student use only digital cameras for Media Services checkout, new library infospace student computers, and a new computer lab in Washington Hall.
