Brief summary of the project:

To enable a number of buildings on campus to be accessed according to pre-determined time controls and/or user groups using the JagCard as a "key".
The project would remove the need for Public Safety to unlock specified buildings and rooms for after hours access such as computer labs, science labs, art and music studios/practice rooms, sports facilities. It would keep a detailed log of access given enabling students to work safely at nights and weekends. Access can be easily given to certain individuals for a door (such as a certain class for an art studio) or for all students (such as a computer lab).
