

JURGEN BRAUER, PH.D.
PROFESSOR OF ECONOMICS

Jürgen Brauer is a tenured Professor of Economics at Augusta State University's James M. Hull College of Business. He holds an economics undergraduate degree from the Free University of Berlin (1979), and master and doctoral degrees in economics from the University of Notre Dame (1986, 1989). Prior to his present appointment, he taught at St. Mary's College and at the University of Notre Dame (1989-1991). Widely published, he has been a Peace Fellow of the United States Institute of Peace and is a member of the academic honor societies of *Sigma Xi*, *Phi Kappa Phi*, and *Beta Gamma Sigma*. He has lived on five continents.

A teacher of undergraduate and graduate students, globally published columnist, and public speaker, Prof. Brauer carries on wide-ranging scholarship in the fields of peace and conflict research, military affairs, economic development, and economic education.

Prof. Brauer's books include *War and Nature: The Environmental Consequences of War in a Globalized World* (AltaMira Press, 2009), *Castles, Battles, and Bombs: How Economics Explains Military History* (with Hubert van Tuyl; University of Chicago Press, 2008), *Arms Trade and Economic Development* (with J. Paul Dunne; Routledge, 2004), *Arming the South* (with J. Paul Dunne; Palgrave, 2002), *The Economics of Regional Security* (with Keith Hartley; Harwood, 2000), *Economics of Conflict and Peace* (with William Gissy; Avebury, 1997), and *Economic Issues of Disarmament* (with Manas Chatterji; Macmillan and New York University Press, 1993).

Prof. Brauer's work has been published in Dutch, French, Portuguese, and Japanese and, in English, in an array of research journals such as the *Journal of Economic Perspectives*, *Economic Development and Cultural Change*, *Defence and Peace Economics*, the *European Journal of Political Economy*, *Conflict Management and Peace Science*, the *Journal of Economic Surveys*, the *Cambridge Review of International Affairs*, and *Science*. In addition, he has authored and co-authored many book chapters, among others to the *Handbook of Defense Economics*, the *Encyclopedia of Arms Control and Disarmament*, the *Oxford International Encyclopedia of Peace*, and to a Festschrift in honor of Nobel-Laureate Jan Tinbergen. Prof. Brauer serves as a reviewer for a variety of scholarly journals, book publishers, and grant-making agencies. He is a member of the editorial boards of *Defence and Peace Economics*, the *International Journal of Economic Development, Conflict and Peace Science*, *Nação e Defesa*, and the *International Journal of Applied Econometrics and Quantitative Studies*. He also co-edits (with Keith Hartley) the *Studies in Defence and Peace Economics* monograph series with Routledge, London, and, with J. Paul Dunne he co-edits *The Economics of Peace and Security Journal* (www.epsjournal.org.uk).

Frequently presenting his work at the major general and specialist professional meetings, Prof. Brauer has been invited to present work in Australia, Canada, China, Colombia, France, Germany, Greece, Hong Kong, India, Italy, Japan, Israel/Palestine, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Portugal, Russia, South Africa, South Korea, Turkey, and the U.K. He has received major funding from the United States Institute of Peace, the Ford Foundation, the MacArthur Foundation, the Winston Foundation, South Africa's National Research Foundation, the One Earth Future Foundation, the Institute of Economy and Peace, and Meltwater News, a commercial internet-based news aggregator and distributor.

To his classroom teaching, Prof. Brauer brings a wide-ranging international dimension, cultural awareness, concise and precise exposition of economic concepts, and technical sophistication. He has taught a wide range of courses, from introductory micro and macroeconomics, to the history of economic thought, quantitative methods (statistics and forecasting), MBA courses, and courses and seminars in the economics of conflict, war, and peace. This interest in education is also reflected in the publication of Jürgen

Brauer, Ron Friesen, and Ed Tower (compilers), *Public Economics III: Public Choice, Political Economy, Peace & War*, Vol. 20 of *Economics: Reading Lists, Course Outlines, Exams, Puzzles & Problems* (Durham, NC: Eno River Press, 1995) and teaching-related publications in peer-reviewed journals such as the *Journal of Economic Education*, *Perspectives on Economic Education Research*, and *Classroom Experiments*. His co-authored web site (with Greg Delemeester) on classroom games attracts many visitors.

Among professional societies, Prof. Brauer is a member of the American Economic Association and a Fellow, Economists for Peace and Security where he served as vice-chair from 1998 to 2005. He is also a Fellow with the Inter-University Seminar on Armed Forces and Society, a member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS), and a member of the academic honor societies of *Sigma Xi*, *Phi Kappa Phi*, and *Beta Gamma Sigma*. He is a member of the Peace Science Society International and founding member of the Asian Peace Science Network. Prof. Brauer has served as consultant to the World Bank, the United Nations, NATO, the U.S. National Defense University, and to the Chief Economist, Office of the Comptroller, City of New York. For a time, he also served as Senior Research Consultant to the Council on Economic Priorities in New York City. He held Visiting Professorships at the Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University in Port Elisabeth, South Africa, in 2003, and at the Australian Defence Force Academy in Canberra, in 2005 and 2008, and at Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok, Thailand, in 2008 and 2009. In 2008, he was a Visiting Scholar at the University of Colorado, Boulder, and Research Director for the nearby One Earth Future Foundation. In fall 2009, he was visiting professor of economics at the Universidad del Rosario, Bogotá, Colombia.

A native Berliner with permanent U.S. residency, Prof. Brauer lived and worked in the Kingdom of Swaziland for several years following his undergraduate work at the Free University of Berlin. He enjoys classical music, motorcycle touring, various sports, and the outdoors. He is also a published underwater photographer and a certified scuba diving instructor and CPR/First Aid instructor.
