

United Streaming Resource List

You will be creating a LiveText document that includes 10 video clips from Discovery Education United Streaming. These clips can be on a particular subject, or can be a mix of various clips you could use in your classroom.

In LiveText, click on Documents.

Click New.

Click on Courses under ASU.

Under Templates, choose Class Assignments.

In the title box, type United Streaming.

Click Save as New.

The LiveText document has now been created. Now you need to add your clips.

Click on Manage Sections.

Click Create Section and then choose Resources.

Title it United Streaming. Click OK.

Click on United Streaming.

Click Add Discovery Education Streaming.

Click Continue if you get a security warning.

You will be directed to the United Streaming site. Choose a subject or concept you want to search for. For example, you could search for World War II videos. Type it in the search box at the top of the page.
